

GENERAL ACTIVITIES

SRI celebrated 93rd "Foundation Day: Sugarcane Research Institute of RPCAU, Pusa celebrated its 93rd "Foundation Day" on 1st April, 2025. Inaugural session was chaired by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Dr. P. S. Pandey, RPCAU, Pusa and the Chief Guest of Foundation Day was Dr. V. P. Singh, Former, Director, SRI, Pusa and Former Vice-Chancellor, Rajendra Agricultural University (RAU), Pusa. All the Dean Director of the university, Sugarcane Factory Officials and Progressive Farmers along with Head of Departments and faculties attended the programme. Brain Storming Session was also organized under the chairmanship of Dr. V. P. Singh. Faculties and heads of different departments discussed the burning issues related to quality seed production, insect-pest management, mechanization, waterlogging, micronutrient application, and processing techniques for sugarcane, as well as value addition in different jaggery products.

Students Participation in Conference: Students of the Food and Nutrition (FND) second semester actively participated in the annual conference of the Society of Renal Nutrition and Metabolism (SRNMCOM 2025), held at Hotel Maurya, Patna on April 26, 2025. - 1. Nutritional Assessment of Renal Patients: This session covered biochemical markers, patient counselling, and follow-up strategies essential for effective nutritional management in nephrology.
- 2. Nutrition in Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD): The workshop addressed evidence-based dietary interventions and nutritional support for patients with chronic kidney conditions.

- It matures in 118 days.
- It possesses high degree of resistance against leaf blast, rust, smut, brown spot, downy mildew and leaf blight.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

Poshan Pakhwada celebrated by KVK, Gopalganj: Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), Gopalganj, celebrated Poshan Pakhwada from 15 to 21April, 2025, across various Anganwadi centers in villages including Kuchaikote, Bakhari Balua Tola, and Tola Sipaya. The programme witnessed active participation from 55 individuals, including Anganwadi Sevikas, Sahaikas, and children. The aim of this programme was to develop a nutri-garden in each anganwadi centre to enhance the nutritional status of young children to tackle the key issues of under nutrition, malnutrition, anaemia, low birth

weight. Focusing on early childhood nutrition to prevent starving and obesity to create healthier and better nourished population. Participants were encouraged to consume locally available, nutritious, and diverse foods, along with maintaining adequate water intake. To support the initiative, KVK Gopalganj distributed nutri-garden seed kits to participating centers. In parallel, a one-day workshop-cumtraining programme for sugarcane growers was also organized by Vishnu Sugar Mills, Gopalganj. During the session, the Subject Matter Specialist (SMS) in Crop Production from KVK delivered a lecture on "Scientific and Improved Cultivation Practices of Sugarcane."



TRAINING/WORKSHOP/SEMINAR/ AWARENESS PROGRAMMES ORGANIZED



The session featured a distinguished talk by Dr. Peter Emmrich, Group Leader at the John Innes Centre (JIC), Norwich, UK, on the topic "Unlocking the Resilience of Grasspea: From Genomics to the Seed System." Dr. Emmrich shared cutting-edge research insights into the genetic improvement, stress resilience, and sustainable seed systems of grasspea—a legume of significant importance for food security in marginal environments. The session was chaired by the Dean, CBS&H, and witnessed active participation from around 50 attendees, including faculty members, research scholars, and students, fostering an inclusive and vibrant academic environment.
